The Hjalli model is meant to meet every child as it is and respect and accept the diverse needs of age groups, genders and individuals. The school should also respect the children's freedom of choice and different interests and nurture everyone's success in a broad sense.





How did it start?

Hjalli Model ideology started with its founder Margrét Pála 30 years ago in 1989

Magga Pála was running a kindergarten in Hafnafjörður called Hjalli and wanted to transform the school system with new approaches and original ideas.

In 1999 she founded Hjallastefnan to run the Hjalli model ideology independently.

What started as one kindergarten is now an independent organization.

Hjalli Model is running 18 schools in Iceland and one in Scotland.

The first basic principle

Children and parents



The Hjalli Model approach is designed to accept each child as it is and respect and acknowledge different needs of every age group, gender, and individual. The school is also required to recognize individual freedom of choice and different sets of interests for each child and, in the broadest sense, foster success for everyone.



The second basic principle

Staff

The Hjalli Model approach is intended to promote positivity, joy, and geniality when communicating with the children, their parents, and anyone else that is involved with the schools.

The third basic principle

The environment



The Hjalli Model approach is intended to create a community within each school where balance, simplicity, and transparency characterize the program, the environment, and materials, and rules are visible and tangible. Thus, providing the children with an understandable and manageable environment according to their age, develor ment, and ability.

The fourth basic principle

Materials



The Hjalli Model approach is intended to provide open-ended play materials and simple learning materials where creativity and imagination are paramount for each child's diverse experience. Thereby, self-reliant individuals create their learning and play world with their own solutions, where reality-based projects are given the greatest weight.

The fifth basic principle

Nature



The Hjalli Model approach is intended to teach children to sense and enjoy the natural environment and respect nature by being frugal, content, and showing moderation, as well as practising maintenance and recycling.

The sixth basic principle

Community



The Hjalli Model approach is intended to practise a code of conduct and behaviour positively and warmly but at the same time be assertive and honest. With stability and precision comes security and freedom, providing peace for all in the school community, which later will result in responsible participation in a democratic society.








Each Hjalli Model Playschool is divided into departments (cores) that are very independent and self-sufficient in most ways.

Within the departments children have their own groups and a group leader (teacher) that stays the same throughout the year.

Choice-Meeting and Playtime



- Choice-Meeting and Playtime take up half of the schedule at every Hjalli Model Playschool.
- The choice-meeting and playtime is our way to secure the child's independence. The choice system serves as a frame, removing adult power.
- In the choice-meeting children learn;

-First, to practice their ability to know what they want and choose between two or more options.

-Second, to gain experience in making their wishes known democratically in a just and transparent system.

-Third and lastly, the choice system is intended to train the children in a controlled amount of adversity and prepare them to the able to handle it with serenity.


Group Time

Course 2: **Independence** Key concepts are empowerment, confidence, selfreliance and expression.


Course 4: **Positivity** Key concepts are assertiveness, candour, optimism and joy.
